**AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE
VILLAGE ADMINISTRATOR TO TRANSFER TO THE LIBERTY UNION-
THURSTON SCHOOL DISTRICT OBSOLETE AND UNUSED VILLAGE
PROPERTY, TO WIT: ONE (1) MOTOR VEHICLE PREVIOUSLY
USED BY THE VILLAGE POLICE DEPARTMENT,
AND THE DECLARATION OF AN EMERGENCY**

WHEREAS, the Village owns one (1) obsolete and unused motor vehicle previously utilized by the Village Police Department; and,


WHEREAS, the motor vehicle has nominal to no fair market value, and can be utilized by the Liberty Union-Thurston School District (hereafter "School District") in order to transport students to special services; and,

WHEREAS, the authorization to transfer the motor vehicle to the School District needs to be approved in a timely fashion in order for the School District to realize the immediate benefit of the use of the motor vehicle;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF
THE VILLAGE OF BALTIMORE, FAIRFIELD COUNTY, OHIO,
THREE-FOURTH'S (3/4'S) OF ITS MEMBERS CONCURRING:

SECTION 1: The Village Administrator is hereby authorized to transfer to the Liberty Union-Thurston School District obsolete and unused miscellaneous Village property, to wit: one (1) motor vehicle previously used by the Police Department, consisting of a 2008 Ford Crown Victoria, with nominal to no fair market value. A copy of the title to the motor vehicle to be transferred is attached hereto and incorporated herein.

SECTION 2: For the reasons noted in the preamble, this ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety, morals, and welfare of the citizens of Baltimore, Ohio. Therefore, this ordinance shall become effective upon its passage by Council.
