AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 452.18 OF THE BALTIMORE CODIFIED ORDINANCES (PARKING DURING HEAVY SNOWFALL)

WHEREAS, the Village desires to amend Chapter 452.18 of the Baltimore Codified Ordinances (Parking During Heavy Snowfall) in order to include additional streets or portions thereof, and to further clarify a snow emergency; and,

WHEREAS, Safety Committee has reviewed and recommended the adoption of these amendments; and,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL
OF VILLAGE OF BALTIMORE, FAIRFIELD COUNTY, OHIO,
A MAJORITY OF ITS MEMBERS CONCURRING:

SECTION 1: That Section 452.18 (Parking During Heavy Snowfall) of the Codified Ordinances, which currently reads as follows:

“452.18 PARKING DURING HEAVY SNOWFALL.

- (a) In order to facilitate the movement of traffic, and to combat the hazards of excessive snow and ice on streets or portions of streets named in division (d) of this section, the Mayor in his discretion may declare an emergency due to such hazards.
- (b) After such emergency has been declared it shall be unlawful during the period of the emergency for any person to park or cause or permit to remain parked his automobile on those streets or portions thereof named in division (d) hereof.
- (c) Any motor vehicle found parked on those streets or portions thereof named in division (d) hereof during the time of such emergency shall be removed at the order of the Chief of Police and shall subject the owner or operator to the fines provided herein.
- (d) The streets or portions thereof where parking is prohibited after an emergency has been declared are the following:
 - Basil Street from the south village limits to the north village limits
 - Main Street from the south village limits to the north village limits
 - Market Street from the east village limits to the west village limits
 - Oak Street from Market Street to Railroad Street
 - Tower Street from Market Street to Washington Street
 - Union Street from Market Street to Washington Street
 - Washington Street from State Route 256 to Tower StreetAny other streets or portions thereof as may be determined by the Chief of Police.
- (e) In order to assist the motorist in determining the streets affected by this section, the Mayor shall notify the local newspapers and radio news stations which he deems appropriate that a snow emergency has been declared on the streets or portions thereof noted in division (d) of this section.
- (f) The owner or operator of any vehicle found parked on any streets named in division (d) of this section during such an emergency shall be guilty of a minor misdemeanor. (Ord. 618. Passed 5-16-66; Am. Ord. 85-5. Passed 3-25-85.)”

shall be amended to read as follows:

“452.18 PARKING DURING HEAVY SNOWFALL.

- (a) In order to facilitate the movement of traffic, and to combat the hazards of excessive snow and ice on streets or portions of streets named in division (d) of this section, **either** the Mayor in his discretion **or Fairfield County** may declare an emergency due to such hazards.
- (b) After such emergency has been declared it shall be unlawful during the period of the emergency for any person to park or cause or permit to remain parked his automobile on those streets or portions thereof named in division (d) hereof.

- (c) Any motor vehicle found parked on those streets or portions thereof named in division (d) hereof during the time of such emergency, shall be removed at the order of the Chief of Police and shall subject the owner or operator to the fines provided herein.
- (d) The streets or portions thereof where parking is prohibited after an emergency has been declared are the following, **and except where otherwise specifically noted, parking shall be limited to one side of the street only:**
- Basil Street from the south village limits to the north village limits
 - Main Street from the south village limits to the north village limits
 - Market Street from the east village limits to the west village limits
 - Oak Street from Market Street to Railroad Street
 - Tower Street from Market Street to Washington Street
 - Union Street from Market Street to Washington Street
 - Washington Street from State Route 256 to Tower Street
 - **Maple Street between High Street and Basil Street**
 - **N. Walnut Street between Mulberry Street and W. Market Street**
 - **Creekview Street**
 - **W. Cliff Street**
 - **N. Park Street between E. Market Street and Mulberry Street**
 - Any other streets or portions thereof as may be determined by the Chief of Police.
- (e) In order to assist the motorist in determining the streets affected by this section, **either the Mayor or Fairfield County may** notify local newspapers and radio news stations that a snow emergency has been declared.
- (f) The owner or operator of any vehicle found parked on any streets named in division (d) of this section during such an emergency shall be guilty of a minor misdemeanor.

SECTION 2: This ordinance shall become effective at the earliest period authorized by law.
